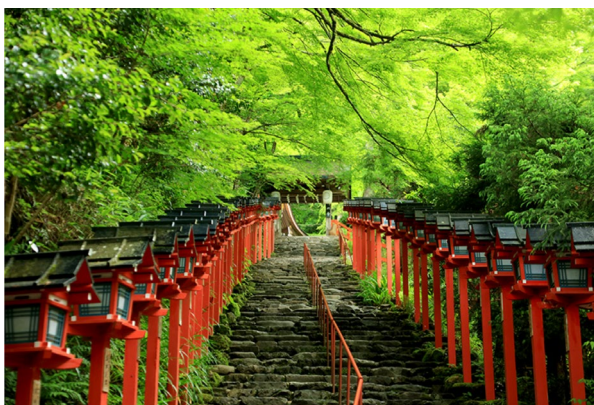

List of attractions



As much as any temple, [Nara Park](#) is a focal point for life in the historic city. Nara Park is a massive park at the foot of Mt. Wakakusa. Established in 1880, the expansive public area covers around 660 hectares and includes many of Nara's most notable attractions including Todai-ji, Kasuga Taisha, Kofuku-ji and Nara National Museum. Most famously, the park is populated by more than one thousand playful and friendly deer that have become a symbol of the city.

[Sanzen-in Temple](#). On the temple ground, monumental halls stand, surrounded by gardens graceful in each season. Shuheki-en that lets you see the pond from the reception hall and Yusei-en viewed from Shinden are especially acclaimed as great artwork. Also, throughout the mossy garden, you get to see guardian deities of children made by stone sculptor Takashi Sugimura.



[Kifune-jinja Shrine](#) is an ancient shrine located in a village in the mountainous area north of Kyoto and is actually a complex of three shrines located in different positions up a hillside. The best-known feature on the grounds is the well-worn stone staircase lined by distinctive red wooden lanterns. Each of the shrines has its own appeal, the middle shrine being notable for its location in a grove of ancient, towering cedar trees. It enshrines the god of water and rain, and was visited in the past by Imperial envoys that came to pray for rain.

Arashiyama (Storm Mountain) is a district on the western outskirts of Kyoto, Japan. It is a nationally designated historic site and place of scenic beauty. And tourist can take the Sagano Romantic Train, which is a sightseeing train uses the old Sanin train line. With mountain cherry blossoms and fresh green in the springtime, the voices of cicadas and the sound of the rain and river in the summer, brilliant autumn leaves in the fall, and snowy scenery in the winter—perfect for taking in the best of the seasonal scenery along the Hozukyo Gorge.
